

Translate webpages & documents

On some devices, you can translate entire webpages and documents.

Translate websites

On your computer, go to Google Translate.

In the text box, enter a URL.

To choose the language you want to translate to, at the top right, click the Down arrow Down Arrow.

On the right, click the URL that appears. The URL will open a new tab and the website will be translated.

Tip: You can also translate in your browser.

Translate documents

You can translate documents up to 10MB in size and in any of these formats: .doc, .docx, .odf, .pdf, .ppt, .pptx, .ps, .rtf, .txt, .xls, .xlsx.

On your computer, go to Google Translate.

At the top left, click Documents.

Click Browse your computer and find the file you want to translate.

To choose the language you want to translate to, at the top right, click the Down arrow Down Arrow.

Click Translate.

You can translate documents only on medium and large screens. Some original formatting could be lost after translation.

Translate webpages in Chrome

When you come across a page written in a language you don't understand, you can use Chrome to translate the page.

On your computer, open Chrome.

Go to a webpage written in another language.

At the top, click Translate.

Chrome will translate the webpage this one time.

Not working? Try refreshing the webpage. If it's still not working, right-click anywhere on the page. Then, click Translate to [Language].
